Topic (History)

- To understand the impact that the changing power of monarchs had on society through the Tudor period.
- To understand the social divide in Tudor Times and how it affected people.
- To identify what the Tudors enjoyed as social leisure and entertainment.

Music

Listen to and evaluate historical music from a range of periods, evaluate and identify instruments used.

Sound

- Identify how sounds are made.
