Communication and Language

- Develop our imaginative thinking and language skills through Story Dough.
- Continuing to develop listening skills and respond to more complex instructions.
- Enjoy listening to longer stories and be able to recall much of what has happened in conversation and role play.
- Using an increasingly wide and rich range of vocabulary when speaking through group time and free flow play.
- Learning how to respond to 'why' questions through stories and play.
- Learning and joining in with a wide range of songs.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Play with one or more other children, extending and elaborating play ideas.
- Learning to share and play alongside others and find solutions to potential conflicts.
- Using Zones of Regulation to help learn how to discuss and describe their feelings, understand the feelings of others and learn to manage their own feelings when necessary.
- Encouraging and providing opportunities to talk and to gain confidence within class.

Literacy
